Council recently held the Australia Day Awards Celebration on Sunday, 26 January, at Portland Hall, St Helens, bringing the community together to honor this year's nominees. This year's Australia Day Ambassador was Vicki Purnell, whose tireless advocacy and community work have touched countless lives. Founder of the Bride's Blossoms and Blessings project, she has supported families experiencing loss and expanded her work to assist those with dementia, women facing cancer treatment, and residents of women's shelters. A gynecological cancer survivor, Vicki also raises awareness through the Survivors Teaching Students program. Her efforts have earned her the 2019 Local Hero for Tasmania title and an OAM in 2022. "It was a privilege to have Vicki as our Ambassador this year. Her work reminds us of the importance of compassion and advocacy. Her story is a testament to the impact one person can have and inspires us all," said Mayor Tucker.

Weed of the month - African boxthorn

African boxthorn is a tough woody weed with sparse small leaves guarded by dangerous sharp spines, which can get through the soles of shoes. Its white flowers are followed by bright orangered berries which are spread by birds. It is often found where birds perch and roost, along fence lines, under trees, and rock out crops. African boxthorn displaces native vegetation, invades pastures and provides protective habitat for animals, including rabbits.

African boxthorn is a Declared Pest in Tasmania and is found in numerous areas in the Break O'Day area.

Young plants can be pulled or dug; larger

ones require mechanical help.

Herbicides can be used, but its toughness and light leaf cover mean follow-up treatment is needed. Cut and paint methods are often used but taking great care with the spines. Be sure to return and control any new seedlings and reshooting from roots.

Break O'Day Welcomes Regional University Study Hub in St Helens

Council is excited that the East Coast has been chosen as one of 10 locations for a new Regional University Study Hub with the initial focus being to establish a Hub in St Helens. This initiative will provide local students of all ages with better access to tertiary and vocational education without having to leave the East Coast.

Study Hubs offer essential support, including campus-style facilities and guidance, helping students succeed and gain qualifications that benefit both them and the community. Mayor Tucker called the hub a "game-changer" for the East Coast and Fingal Valley, making tertiary and vocational education more accessible for regional students.

Supported by the Tasmanian Government through the Eastern Strategic Regional Partnership, extensive work was undertaken to understand the nature and extent of need for a Study Hub to service the east coast of Tasmania. It will initially launch in St Helens, with plans to expand into the Fingal Valley and further down the East Coast as it grows. The Hub is expected to be operational by mid-2025.

Regional University Study Hubs have been proven to increase participation in higher education, particularly in key fields like health and education. Break O'Day Council looks forward to working with all stakeholders to ensure this initiative delivers lasting benefits.
